



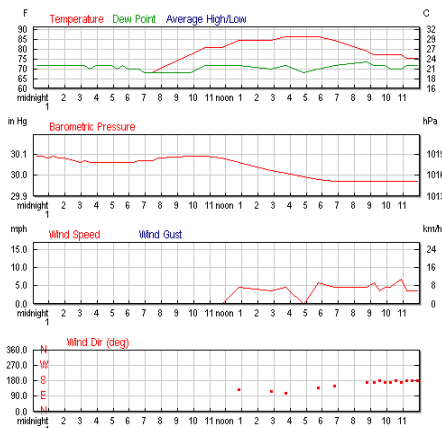

Information/History of Location:
